
challenges they have encountered and what questions remain about curriculum mapping...



Curriculum Mapping Sweeps Hawaii

A major curriculum mapping initiative has been ongoing in the state of Hawaii. **The Hawaii Department of Education** is highly recommending that schools look at mapping as a 21st century professional development strategy and a replacement tool. The department has created training modules on curriculum mapping and how it supports standards-based grading and reporting. The state has benchmark maps to guide teachers in bundling standards around big ideas that can be covered by quarters.

To support the use of technology, schools are encouraged to look at either a commercial software program or have access to a local program being developed as part of the Lotus Notes system. Although schools are at various stages, the state sees curriculum mapping as a wonderful planning and communication tool.

Monica Mann, state assessment specialist, has helped coordinate efforts on the varous islands. During February, Dr. Heidi Hayes Jacobs worked with faciliators on the Big Island of Hawaii at a training in Kona as well as in Lihue on the island of Kauai. In addition there was a two day Training of Trainers attended by both independent and

public school educators from all of the islands and the mainland. Special focus is being give to linking assessment data on learners with maps.
